AT HOME: The Brewers are 24-17 at home, going 6-4-3 in series play....after a 2-6 start, the team is 22-11 over its last 33 home games....had a season-high 6-game home winning streak from 4/17-4/22....the team went 46-38 at home last season, going 14-9-4 in series play.

ON THE ROAD: The Brewers are 24-18 on the road, going 8-4-2 in series play....had a season-high 5-game road winning streak from 4/30-5/11....the team went 40-38 on the road last season, going 13-11-2 in series play.

MANAGER: **Craig Counsell** is in his fourth season as manager of the Brewers (267-277) and third full season....he was named the 19th manager in franchise history on 5/4/15, replacing **Ron Roenicke**....bio is on p. 44 of the media guide.

COACHES: Hitting coach **Darnell Coles** (4th season), pitching coach **Derek Johnson** (3rd season), coach **Jason Lane** (3rd season), bench coach **Pat Murphy** (3rd season), third base coach **Ed Sedar** (12th season, 8th as 3B coach), first base/infield coach **Carlos Subero** (3rd season) and bullpen coach **Lee Tunnell** (6th season) all returned from the 2017 staff.

LET'S GO TO THE VIDEO TAPE: The Brewers have made 11 replay challenges, going 4-7....their last challenge (won) came on 6/18 at Pittsburgh as a safe call at second base involving Gregory Polanco was overturned....team went 17-27 in 44 replay challenges last season.

TONIGHT'S STARTER: #35 - LHP BRENT SUTER (17g, 15gs, 8-5, 4.28)

SUTER AT A GLANCE: Brent Suter, 28, is making his 18th appearance and 16th start of the season and second start vs. Minnesota....he last started last Wednesday vs. Kansas City and took a 5-4 loss (6ip, 6h, 4r, 4er, 1bb, 6k, 1hr)....he is 6-2 with a 3.50 ERA over his last 8 starts (46.1ip, 18er)....the team is 8-7 in his starts this season....he has made 2 quality starts....opponents are batting .248 (84-for-339, 14hr)....Suter, who made his first career Opening Day roster, was selected in the 31st round of the 2012 First-Year Player Draft....bio is on p. 135 of the media guide....name pronounced "soo-ter."

THE STANSBURY OF THE EAST: Like GM David Stearns, Suter is a Harvard graduate....he earned a degree in environmental science and public policy.

LAST SEASON: Suter went 3-2 with a 3.42 ERA in 22 games / 14 starts during six stints....he was named Brewers Unsung Hero as voted on by members of the Milwaukee Chapter of the BBWAA....he was 3-2 with a 3.45 ERA as a starter (70.1ip, 27er) and 0-0 with a 3.18 ERA in relief (11.1ip, 4er)....the team went 9-5 in his starts....he had 4 quality starts....opponents batted .263 (83-for-315, 8hr)....Suter was named Brewers Pitcher of the Month for July (5gs, 2-0, 1.50era)....he was on the 10-day disabled list from 8/13-8/31 with a left rotator cuff strain....he also went 3-1 with a 4.42 ERA in 10 games / 8 starts at Triple-A Colorado Springs.

CAREER: Is 13-9 with a 3.80 ERA in 53 games / 31 starts (191.2ip, 81er)....is in his third Major League season....has gone 10-9 with a 4.18 ERA as a starter (161.1ip, 75er) and 3-0 with a 1.78 ERA in relief (30.1ip, 6er).

CAREER AT MILLER PARK: Is 9-4 with a 3.83 ERA in 30 games / 16 starts (108ip, 46er)....is 5-3 with a 4.47 ERA in 10 games / 8 starts this season (52.1ip, 26er).

CAREER ON THE ROAD: Is 4-5 with a 3.76 ERA in 23 games / 15 starts (83.2ip, 35er)....is 3-2 with a 4.00 ERA in 7 starts this season (36ip, 16er).

CAREER vs. TWINS: Is 1-0 with a 3.72 ERA in 2 starts, both coming at Target Field (9.2ip, 4er)....he earned an 8-3 victory on 5/18 this season (5.2ip, 5h, 1r, 1er, 1bb, 6k) and received a no-decision in a 5-4 loss on 8/7 last season (4ip, 5h, 3r, 3er, 2bb, 2k).

CAREER AT THE PLATE: Is batting .167 (7-for-42) with 1 HR....has 4 walks and 14 strikeouts....his home run came this season on 5/8 vs. Cleveland, a solo shot off Corey Kluber.

THIS SEASON: Is batting .182 (4-for-22) with 1 HR and 3 RBI....has 4 walks and 5 strikeouts....has 1 sacrifice bunt.
