The Brewers have hit a home run in 18 straight games at Great American Ball Park.....the Crew have hit 40 home runs in the streak that dates back to 9/13, 2016.....it is the longest streak by any opponent at the facility and is tied for the longest streak overall.....the Reds also hit a home run in 18 straight games at GABP from 4/25-5/29, 2010.

AT HOME: The Brewers are 24-17 at home, going 6-4-3 in series play.....after a 2-6 start, the team is 22-11 over its last 33 home games.....had a season-high 6-game home winning streak from 4/17-4/22.....the team went 46-38 at home last season, going 14-9-4 in series play.

ON THE ROAD: The Brewers are 24-17 on the road, going 8-4-1 in series play.....had a season-high 5-game road winning streak from 4/30-5/11.....the team went 40-38 on the road last season, going 13-11-2 in series play.

MANAGER: **Craig Counsell** is in his fourth season as manager of the Brewers (267-276) and third full season.....he was named the 19th manager in franchise history on 5/4/15, replacing **Ron Roenicke**.....bio is on p. 44 of the media guide.

COACHES: Hitting coach **Darnell Coles** (4th season), pitching coach **Derek Johnson** (3rd season), coach **Jason Lane** (3rd season), bench coach **Pat Murphy** (3rd season), third base coach **Ed Sedar** (12th season, 8th as 3B coach), first base/infield coach **Carlos Subero** (3rd season) and bullpen coach **Lee Tunnell** (6th season) all returned from the 2017 staff.

LET'S GO TO THE VIDEO TAPE: The Brewers have made 11 replay challenges, going 4-7.....their last challenge (won) came on 6/18 at Pittsburgh as a safe call at second base involving Gregory Polanco was overturned.....team went 17-27 in 44 replay challenges last season.

TONIGHT'S STARTER: #51 - RHP FREDDY PERALTA (4gs, 3-0, 1.59)

PERALTA AT A GLANCE: Freddy Peralta, 22, will make his fifth start....Peralta last started on Tuesday vs. Kansas City and earned a 5-1 victory (7ip, 1h, 0r, 1bb, 10k)....the team is 4-0 in his starts....he has 2 quality starts....opponents are batting .093 (7-for-75, 1hr)....he entered 2018 as the ninth-best prospect in the organization according to *Baseball America*.... Peralta was acquired from Seattle, along with RHP Carlos Herrera and RHP Daniel Missaki, in exchange for 1B Adam Lind on 12/9/15....he was added to the 40-man roster on 11/20/17.... bio on p. 120 of the media guide.

WHAT A HOOT! Peralta's .093 opponent batting average (7-for-75) is the second-lowest mark since 1900 of any pitcher over his first four Major League starts....the only pitcher with a lower opponent batting average is **Burt Hooton** from 1971-72 with the Cubs (.083, 8-for-96).

FREDDY K-RUEGER: Peralta made his Major League debut on 5/13 at Colorado and earned a 7-3 win (5.2ip, 1h, 0r, 2bb, 13k)....he took a no-hitter into the sixth inning before allowing a 1-out single to David Dahl....he tied for the fourth-highest strikeout total in a MLB debut of any pitcher in baseball since 1893....his 13 strikeouts marked a franchise rookie record....he was the ninth pitcher (13x) overall in franchise history to have 13 or more strikeouts in a game.

PERFECT TIMING! Peralta made his Major League debut on Mother's Day in front of his mother (Octavia), father (Pedro) and girlfriend (Maritza), all of whom had never seen him pitch professionally....they were in town originally to see him pitch at Triple-A Colorado Springs.... when Chase Anderson was scratched due to illness, Peralta instead pitched for the Brewers.

AT COLORADO SPRINGS: Peralta was recalled from Triple-A Colorado Springs, where he went 6-1 with a 2.75 ERA in 12 starts (59ip, 45h, 20r, 18er, 27bb, 84k, 1hr)....his 84 strikeouts led the Pacific Coast League at the time of his promotion....the team went 8-4 in his starts.... opponents batted just .208 (45-for-216, 1hr).

LAST SEASON: Peralta went 3-8 with a 2.63 ERA and 1 save in 25 games / 19 starts between Class-A Carolina and Double-A Biloxi....he held opponents to a .178 batting average with 169 strikeouts in just 120.0 innings....his 169 strikeouts led Brewers minor leaguers and tied for ninth in Minor League Baseball....his 2.63 ERA ranked second among Brewers farmhands.... he was a Carolina League All-Star.

AT THE PLATE: Is 0-for-8 with 5 strikeouts.
